Voters are aware of rising prices and inflation in the United States and **are concerned about the rising prices of various economic commodities.**

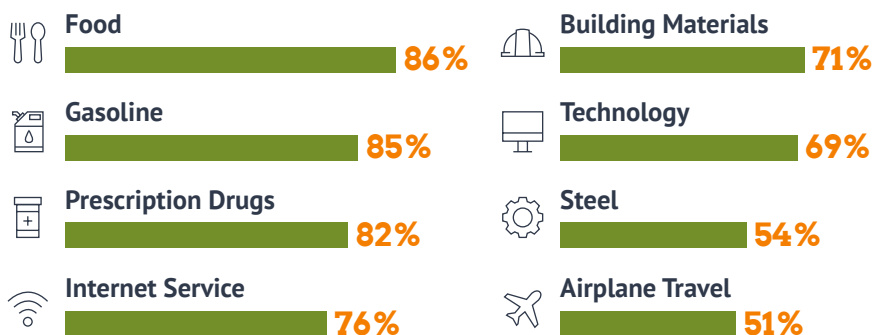

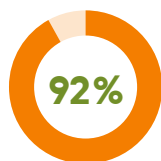

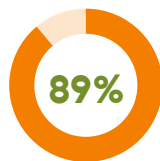

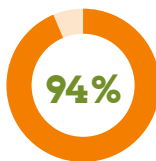
A bipartisan majority of voters feel that promoting competition is important to a strong economy.

8 in 10 voters

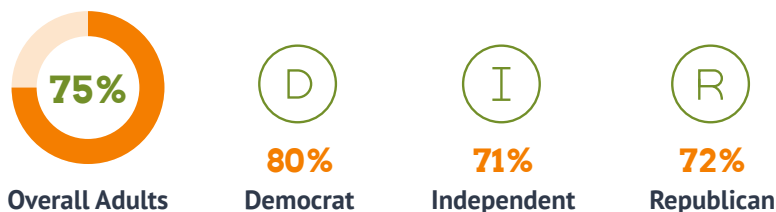
including a bipartisan majority, feel that federal laws that protect consumers and businesses from anti-competitive and monopolistic practices should be revisited within 10 years of their creation.

Fostering Competition

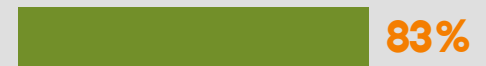
A strong bipartisan majority of voters feel that President Biden's Executive Order is **important to fostering competition in the transportation sector**.

Methodology:

This poll was conducted between September 9-September 15, 2021 among a sample of 1998 Registered Voters. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of Registered Voters based on gender by age, educational attainment, race, marital status, home ownership, race by educational attainment, 2020 presidential vote, and region. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 2 percentage points.
